David, who is quickly establishing himself as one of Britain's most talented racing drivers, has chosen to raise funds for his local Garden House Hospice as he completes the gruelling 54 mile London to Brighton. The young race driver, who studies engineering at Brunel University has been supported by local businesses from Hertfordshire throughout the 2011 season, one which he has dominated this year with a near 100% record.

This bike ride is a great way for me to put something back in to the community and help raise awareness for the charities"

The bike ride takes place on the 11th September 2011, travelling from South London through Mitcham, Carshalton, Chipstead, Banstead, Haywards Heath and finally Brighton.
